## The History of the Graystone building-

The ownership of the old Graystone building can be traced back to our founder, John Enoch. It is located on corner of Newell and Detroit Streets. It was a Lutheran Church built of stone in 1858, condemned in 1905, and a new wooden church was built the same year. It was sold then torn down to build the Linco Filling Station in 1931. Lenny Levan bought it in 1965 and ran Lenny's Graystone Restaurant. During this time Dick Barrett had an A&W Root beer stand out back.

Linda Kilgore had Wren Kilgore HER Realtors until 2018 when they sold the building and went mobile. It was said that the bricks and stone from the Lutheran Church were used to build the Linco Filling Station and in the attic it shows there are bricks on the inside and stone on the outside. It is believed that the original ceiling was uncovered in the part of building that was added on along with the uncovering of part of the stone wall on the inside that was covered by many layers of paneling. Now about the new owner... but that's another story!
