West Liberty Historical Markers by Tami Wenger


As you may know I am a West Liberty history buff and love every thing concerning our little hamlet like books, stories, maps, pictures, post cards, relics, memories, etc. tale signs still left through out town of times past. Recently my cousin, Dale Humble, posted drone pictures of a historical spot in town on Face Book. He left it up for people to guess where and what was historically significant about the spot.

Turns out it was what was left of the old railroad trestle bridge that weakened and fell during the flood of 1913, plunging the engine and another rail car into the flood waters. I knew from the stories that this happened south of town but didn't know its exact location.

I wondered, with the other historical markers we have why there was not one of the flood or the fire in 1880. Since there isn't, who else besides me, would be interested in making this happen?

I have a couple of sources to check out besides the Ohio Historical Marker page. Please let me know if you are interested in pursing this endeavor or not. Also we would need to think about the cost and where to put it if we decide to get one. It would be cheaper to put the flood story on one side and the fire on the other as opposed to getting two.




THE FIRST PERMANENT SUNDAY SCHOOL in the "Old" Menionite Church, founded by the authority of the church, was organized in the Logan County Amish Mennonite Church, now the South Union Church, one and seven-tenths miles northwest of this location, June 7, 1863, by Preacher David Plank assisted by Bishop Jacob C. Kenagy with the counsel of the congregation.
